1/8/2021, 2:45 PM		Crosswalk on 2nd at Lawrence	1 Pedestrian / Bicyclist	<p>12/28/20, MattS: After reviewing the site and another consultant's streetscape improvement plans for 2nd St, the best location for the crossing would be on the south of Lawrence. I do not believe there is enough right of way on the north side to install the curb ramps to cross 2nd St plus an utility pole would need to be relocated. Usually average around \$3,500 to \$5,000 a curb ramp which includes utility relocations, removals, base rock, concrete, curb, truncated domes, and warning signs. Since the existing curb ramps are out of ADA (American Disability Act) standards, I believe we would replace the other ramps at the same time. In total, 6 ramps would need to reconstruction/construction which totals between \$21,000 to \$30,000. There would be some utility relocations and other removals that would push the total more towards the \$30,000. It is possible the curb ramp improvements at 2nd and Lawrence could be included into another project called Clark Storm Sewer.</p>	H O L D
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<p>1/8/2021, 2:42 PM</p>		<p>Traffic Calming Request for raised intersection or speed tables</p>	<p>5 Traffic Calming</p>	<p>12/29/20, MattS: After looking into a bit further, a raised intersection is very costly verses some of the other traffic calming devices. To be done correctly, the intersection should be removed and poured back monolithically. I don't know of a decent product that will adhere to concrete with a taper up to 3in to get the raised profile. I would recommend looking into the speed table devices. The speed table profile raising the roadway 3in for 10ft with a 6ft taper on either side. Speed tables should be installed in 200ft spacing or more on a continuous roadway. I recommend installing at least two speed tables between Muegge Rd and Par Dr on Bogey Estates Dr. One installment would be close to 148 #12 Green Dr and the other one by 180 Bogey Estates Dr. Since the roadway is concrete, only the portion were the taper and raised section will needed to reconstructed. Each speed table will cost around \$10,000 with a total of \$20,000 for two installments. Special attention to the roadway drainage will be needed at each location. Also I have reached out to a traffic control vendor for pricing on temporary speed tables in case we want to try out less permanent solution.
