

Summary of St. Charles Pedestrian Laws

- ✦ Pedestrians may cross roadways at any marked or unmarked crosswalk when facing a green signal unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian signal (345.020.A)
- ✦ Pedestrians who have partially completed crossing on the walk signal shall proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone while the wait signal is showing (310.070.A2)
- ✦ In the absence of traffic control signals, drivers shall yield to pedestrians crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is in or approaching the vehicle travel lane (345.020.A)
- ✦ Pedestrians may cross any roadway not at a crosswalk except within business districts or when designated by ordinance (345.060.B)



Summary of St. Charles Pedestrian Laws

- ✦ Pedestrians crossing at an unmarked roadway shall yield the right of way to vehicles in the roadway (345.050.A)
- ✦ Pedestrians shall not cross a roadway at any place other than by a route at right angles to the curb or by the shortest route to the opposite curb except in a crosswalk (345.040)
- ✦ Where sidewalks are provided it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway (345.080.A)
- ✦ In the absence of sidewalks, pedestrians shall walk on the left side of the roadway or its shoulder facing traffic (345.080.B)
- ✦ Drivers emerging from alleys or driveways shall stop prior to driving onto a sidewalk area and shall yield the right of way to any pedestrian (335.040)
